Serving persecuted Christians in Sudan

Dr. Peter Meade is a long-time Mission Doctor who recently served for two months at Mother of Mercy Hospital in the Nuba mountains in the south of Sudan.

The area served by Mother of Mercy is very remote, very hot, and the people in this region, having lived through many years of war and repression, now live in extreme poverty. The Catholic bishops in Sudan and South Sudan recently said, **“It is a difficult year for our two countries because many still die due to armed conflict- women, children and elderly killed, and even the sick killed in their sick bed.”**

Despite these overwhelming challenges, Peter witnessed a people who were incredibly kind, welcoming, and as members of the Catholic Church, filled with faith in God above all else. **As Christians in Sudan continue to be persecuted for their beliefs, Peter was truly moved most by their enduring faith. He later shared that it was one of the greatest honors of his life to worship side by side with them.**

It was this faithfulness, not the oppressive heat, that stood out the most for Peter during his time in Sudan.

Dr. Meade, a general surgeon, stepped in for medical missionary Dr. Tom Catena, an American doctor from Amsterdam, New York, who has served in this region of Sudan since 2008, even during some of the most aggressive phases of the conflict.” In 2019, Mission Doctors honored Dr. Tom Catena with the Catholic Doctor of the Year award for his

selfless service and faith in the face of war and violence. A documentary available on Netflix, “The Heart of Nuba” highlights Dr. Catena’s work in Sudan.



Less than a Pound and Saving Lives

“We finally made it back to Likuni Mission Hospital! Two years ago, we raised the money to purchase a point of care ultrasound. A point of care ultrasound allows the provider to make timely diagnoses that save lives. There is no waiting for a radiology technician, radiologist, transporting patients to other parts of the hospital (or to the hospital), firing up the generator, finding the person with the key who can turn on the generator, etc...”

We presented numerous lectures, but most of the time was spent through hands-on teaching on the handheld ultrasound. Thanks again for all your support and we look forward to further journeys together!”

You made it possible for doctors and nurses to provide the quick, accurate diagnosis they need to save lives at Likuni! This hand held ultrasound can detect *“breech presentations, ectopic pregnancies, placenta previas, various life threatening trauma conditions, gallstones, kidney stones, severe dehydration, blood loss, etc...”* giving the staff time to provide care and save lives.
