Since our Mission Doctors have returned home, many have been on the frontlines caring for patients in need. We wanted to share their stories and words of thanks with you.

Dr. Mark Druffner is a Family Medicine Physician with Hudson Physicians in Hudson, Wisconsin. He also stays in contact with the Hospital in Tanzania and wrote *“They are gathering as much PPE as well as encouraging handwashing and social distancing. Unfortunately, there’s no reliable Covid testing right now in our area... At St. Luke’s, there is only two oxygen machines for the hospital and so this has been a struggle. There is no ventilator yet. We are raising money for this purpose. We thank God for all the generous donors that support our work in Tanzania.”*



Dr. Lou and Mrs. Marta Coda left Uganda just as the airport in Entebbe was closing. Dr. Coda is an Internist and Palliative Care Specialist working at Wellspan Palliative Supportive Care in Chambersburg, PA. Lou shared *“Mine is to try and listen to Christ’s calling, whether that is on the ward at St. Francis Hospital Mutolere in Uganda or on the palliative care service at Waynesboro Hospital in Pennsylvania.
