I asked for a small space in our donor newsletter to speak directly to you, our awe-inspiring supporters.



Yet we came together, we hugged, there was a wonderful meal, dancing and an opportunity to honor two remarkable people, Dr. Pat and Mrs. Nora Ryan. The evening included a silent auction of donated items and a celebration of the work of Mission Doctors Association. How truly blessed we feel that we had this special evening, given that a mere week later, the 'stay at home' began to be put into place.

Somehow, it makes the evening all that much more special! 'Our Heart for the World' Gala reaches across the world to let you reach our partners in Latin America and Africa. In Cameroon, a common greeting is 'We are Together' – through this time, we know we are indeed together because of YOU!"

Miracle in the Midst of the Pandemic

“We had not planned to leave Ghana. We planned to keep a low profile and not leave the hospital compound as things got worse.

My due date was March 26. On March 27 at dinner time, we got emails from the embassy that we had seats on a “repatriation” flight that would leave the next day. We had to decide quickly if we should stay or go. We agreed that the safest thing for our family was to go. We quickly packed, including a carry-on with medicines and supplies needed for an in-air birth, and left for the airport.

Thankfully, we made it safely to Connecticut on 3/29 with baby still in the womb. We had time to eat, take a nap, and look up which hospitals took our insurance before my water broke that evening. Sophia Grace was born without complications on 3/30 at 12:17 am.

Sophia and I were both well until around 10 am the next day, when I started bleeding a lot. Medicines and a procedure could not stop the bleeding, and I lost so much blood that I went into disseminated intravascular coagulation (blood has lost or used up all the things that help it to clot). I had to spend the night in the ICU to get blood products and have a uterine artery embolization procedure before the bleeding slowed down. Brian also had everyone he could think of around the world praying for me.

No one knows with certainty the cause of the bleeding. But I am grateful that in God’s perfect timing, we had returned to the US for Sophia’s birth. I got 10 units of blood and required a high-tech medical procedure to save my life - things which would not have been available in rural Ghana. If we hadn’t decided to get on that plane, I might not be here today.

Dr. Robyn Jennings shared this blog last month. Mission Doctors Brian and Robyn Jennings started a long-term mission with their two young children to Ghana this year. They were evacuated on a emergency US Embassy flight. After returning home, Robyn is taking time to recover and care for her new daughter and Brian is looking to start working while they are home.




Mission Doctor Robyn Jennings with little Sophia Grace, following their emergency evacuation and Robyn’s miraculous recovery
