This may just look like a photo of doctors performing surgery, but this photo, this life-saving surgery, is only possible because of you!

This photo was taken at St. Martin de Porres Hospital in northwest Cameroon in West Africa. And, unfortunately, our sisters and brothers in this part of Cameroon have suffered greatly in the last several years. In 2016, the Anglophone region was plunged into crisis after a protest by lawyers and teachers turned violent. According to Cameroon's health ministry, "nearly 30% of hospitals in the northwest region were no longer functioning because of separatist attacks and that hundreds of health workers had fled to French-speaking towns for safety."

And sadly because of this conflict, humanitarian organizations like Doctors without Borders have been banned from the area, creating an even greater crisis for the people of the region.

But, because of you, we were able to say "yes" to the Franciscan sisters in Cameroon. Your support of the Coronavirus Relief Fund allowed us to send the sisters the funds they needed to hire a surgeon and a family practice physician, Dr. Lydien and Dr. Yali. These doctors are able to care for the thousands of patients seeking care at St. Martin de Porres.

Your prayerful support of MDA is saving lives and providing a refuge of hope and healing for our brothers and sisters in Cameroon.

“After almost two years of being away from our beloved friends and work in Bwambo Village, we are returning to bring midwife packs for new mothers (Thank you friends of MDA), medications, oxygen concentrators, and PPE to St. Lukes Hospital. Mark is very much looking forward to working with Fr. Dr. Beda, Fr. Dr. Josaphat, and the nurses to improve safety and precautions against Covid and to bring further assistance to those in need. We are now working to find donated medical equipment for the new St. Elizabeth’s Maternity Center, which will open this Spring. We thank God ahead of time for all that we will provide for the mothers and babies who come for care at St. Lukes.”

Starting on Mission

“I’m excited to go!” When we sat down with Dr. Mary Anne Barnhill in the Mission House chapel, she shared her excitement.

Dr. Barnhill joined the formation program for long-term service in August this year and will start a three-year mission to West Gonja Hospital in Damongo, Ghana, West Africa.

A family practice physician from Fort Worth, TX, Mary Anne knew, like many Mission Doctors, that she wanted to serve internationally in medical school. She said the “seed was planted” while she studied tropical medicine.

However, this will not be Mary Anne’s first medical missionary experience. She has served with LIGA International in Mexico, Doctors without Borders in Niger and the Syrian Medical Society in Greece. During these short-term missions, Dr. Barnhill cared for children treating acute malnutrition, malaria and provided general medical care.

Mary Anne is looking forward to her long-term mission because, as she said, she wants to “fulfill my purpose.” She knows it will be hard to be away from family for three years, but is looking forward to the day to day work, making rounds and practicing “old fashion medicine” without the electronic records. She also shared that she is excited to work with and learn from the incredible doctors and medical support staff at the hospital because of their great clinical skills and extensive knowledge of tropical medicine.

Dr. Barnhill wanted to share with you, Mission Doctor supporters, that “you’re supporting a great organization...they do a lot of preparation to serve overseas, about culture and faith...not many organization do that.” MDA prepares doctors so we can be successful.

Additionally, she has some encouraging words for doctors considering service with MDA - “Do it!” She continued saying that there is such a great need for doctors and medical mission service is so rewarding.

Your support of Mission Doctors makes Mary Anne’s service possible. In January, she will be flying to Ghana to care for our brothers and sisters in need. Please pray for Dr. Mary Anne Barnhill as she continues the four-month Formation Program at our Mission House in Los Angeles.
