Mary travelled for days to be seen at St. Theresa's Hospital in rural Zimbabwe. She was 5'2" and weighed only 65 pounds. When she arrived, Mission Doctor, Richard Stoughton diagnosed her with advanced stage four AIDS.

Despite her advanced stage and the distance she would have to travel for follow-ups, Dr. Stoughton started her on anti-retroviral drugs. At first Mary's condition worsened, but she was eventually able to return home. Over a year later she visited Dr. Stougthon, unrecognizable, at 130 pounds and the picture of health.

Mary, and thousands like her are able

to get the lifesaving care they need because of a unique partnership Mission Doctors has with St. Theresa's Hospital in rural Zimbabwe you make possible.

Situated in a rural poor farming community in Zimbabwe, St. Theresa's Hospital is an oasis of hope. This small 80 to 90-bed hospital run by the Dominican sisters serves about 50,000 people in the area. Many of the patients walk 10 to 15 miles (often a day-long or two day trip) to be seen at St. Theresa's Hospital.

The history of Zimbabwe, once called Rhodesia, has been difficult, and has left the country impacted with... (continued on page 3)

challenges in shortages of resources and access to healthcare. Mission Doctors Association has been part of this history for many, many years, even before independence. Today, Dr. and Mrs. Stoughton continue to lead the efforts to keep St. Theresa's Hospital, in central Zimbabwe, open.

We asked veteran Mission Doctor, Dr. Richard Stoughton to tell us about this lifesaving partnership. Dr. Richard and Loretta Stoughton served at St. Theresa Hospital in Zimbabwe from October 2001 to July 2009. They also were in Rhodesia (ne Zimbabwe) with their family from July 1970 to December 1975. Richard continues to raise funds to help the hospital to continue to function at a high level in spite of tremendous difficulties within the country.

Dr. Stoughton shared that "most of the patients are subsistence farmers, although there are many who come from small business villages and some from larger towns. The very rural people live mostly in round African huts with thatched roofs, live some distance from a clean water source, and only about half will have a latrine of any sort, and of course, no electricity."

St. Theresa's Hospital sees a wide mixture of medial problems like all mission hospitals, but because of the support of people like you, it has an effective AIDS treatment and prevention program. This program has greatly reduced the number of active AIDS patients and those newly diagnosis.

Dr. Stoughton wanted to share a message with you, Mission Doctors donors; "Your donations are able to help people all over the developing world obtain quality health care. There are many, many needs for charitable donations, but few organizations see that the money gets directly to the receiving organization as well as Mission Doctors does."
