Clarissa's water broke. She knew it was too soon. Her sister found a motorcycle taxi and got Clarissa to the hospital. By the time they arrived, she was in active labor, more than a month too early.

In a place like rural Cameroon, in West Africa, a premature baby, even one born just a month too early, has a very challenging road ahead of them.

Because of your support, Mission Doctor, Martha Franz was there to work with our Cameroonian partners. Because of you, Clarissa's son Eugene is now the happy, healthy curious toddler you see in the photo above. Because of you, lives like Eugene's are saved. Today, Mission Doctor Martha Franz is at St. Martin de Porres Hospital caring for patients of all ages, including the premature babies who are facing special challenges. She is working to ensure that the best care can be offered now and in the future.

Working closely with the staff in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, they are striving to enhance the care that can be provided: ensuring that proper vitals are done, keeping the neonates warm in the wooden incubators made on site, and working with the mothers to help ensure the babies have proper nutrition right from the start.

"When 3 year old Hapsatou came to us, she had pneumonia, malaria, and dehydration" Jim Hake, MD recently told a crowd in Washington. "Hapsatou was quite ill with high fever when she arrived, but recovered with the help of IV fluids and antibiotics. What was unique about her stay was that her father was her caregiver. In Cameroon, it usually is the mother or grandmother who stays with a child. One could tell that Hapsatou and her father had a very loving relationship. They both had big smiles on their faces when she was well enough to go home. I will never forget the days children were able to be discharged, as happy for them as for their parents!"

Dr. Hake and other Mission Doctors eagerly seek out opportunities to share stories from their time in service. Mission Doctors' Speakers Bureau helps make this possible.

Neonatal Resuscitation training program, Dr. Martha Franz is able to make a difference that will last well beyond her own three year mission.

We recently spoke with Dr. Martha Franz about the impact of the Neonatal Resuscitation Program or NRP. "Since we have started the NRP program with our nurses and midwives, we have seen a positive change in the outcomes for our youngest, tiniest patients. **Patients in the past who were born too early to breath on their own are now receiving the treatment they need to survive. This training has educated and empowered our partners here to take the lifesaving steps needed at birth and beyond.**"
