Anna traveled down river with her
4 month old. Her baby was born with
a complete bilateral cleft lip and
palate, and hard nasal mass with
failure to thrive. Without
immediate medical care, the little boy
would starve, unable to nurse or use a
bottle

Because of you, Mission Doctor Lucy Goh was there. Dr. Goh was able to insert a GI tube providing life-saving nourishment for her infant.

This is just one of stories, your support makes possible. Having a pediatrician on staff at Santa Clotilde can mean the difference for young patients like Anna's son.

Meet Your Missionaries

Missionaries don't go on Mission, they are sent.

Mission Doctors are sent by all of you who make their mission possible. Serving in response to their faith and sharing their professional skills, Mission Doctors are sent to be a sign of God's love.

We wanted to introduce you to Dr. Susan McNeil and Dr. Zach Gastelum. This summer, Zach and Susan joined the fourmonth formation program for long-term service. During their first week at the Mission House in Los Angeles, we asked them a couple of questions about the journey that led them to Mission Doctors.

Dr. McNeil comes to Mission Doctors from the Dallas area where she has worked in Family Medicine, Pain Management, and Addiction Medicine at Veterans Administration Hospital, North Texas, as well as serving as Assistant Professor at UT Southwestern Medical Center. As a member of the Airforce, Dr. McNeil served as a physician at Langley Air Force Base Hospital in Virginia and was the Director of Air Transportable Clinic during deployments.

As a military veteran, Dr. McNeil brings with her international experience, dedication, and flexibility so as to be prepared for any situation that may arise. A lifelong Catholic, as she pondered retiring, she felt that God was calling her to something more.

We asked Susan why she chose to serve with Mission Doctors and she commented "As a Catholic doctor, I wanted to continue practicing with Catholic ethics in mind and with Catholic doctors in a Catholic hospital." She continued "I like the fact that we go to places where we are invited by the bishop. So there is a need and we're working within the Catholic Church."

Dr. Zach Gastelum completed the Via Christi International Medicine Fellowship in Honduras in June of this year, having graduated from The University of Arizona College of Medicine, Tucson, AZ in 2018 with a focus on Community Service and Global Health. Feeling called to serve as a medical missionary, Dr. Gastelum learned about Mission Doctors from former Mission Doctor, Dr. Lisa Gilbert and Drs. Robyn and Brian Jennings.

We asked Zach about what motivated his service and he shared "one of my favorite quotations from one of my favorite theologians, Bishop Robert Barron, said 'The moment you leave your church on Sunday you enter missionary territory.' That has always spoken to me... You know we are all called to be Missionaries. Some people in their own homes. Some people in their local communities. And for Susan and I, various parts around the world. And I am just really grateful that Mission Doctors exists to help support me in that mission to serve."


