Mission Doctor Lucy Goh is entering her second year of service at Hospital Santa Clotilde (HSC), the rural Catholic hospital that serves more than 22,000 people along the Napo River in the Peruvian Amazon region of Loreto.

She shared that this verse from chapter three of Proverbs "helped me to live life one day at a time, to be aware and be grateful to Him for his many blessings, to offer up whatever is worrying me, e.g., about the challenges I face, about my patients, about depressing news of outbreaks of war, natural disasters, gun violence, and the horrendous suffering endured by innocent people."

Like Mission Doctors serving around the world, Lucy is often faced with the challenges of caring for our poor brothers and sisters with limited resources "The big clinical challenge we face is trying to diagnose and treat patients with the limited laboratory and diagnostic resources available. We do the best we can with what we have here."

This hospital is the head of a network of 12 health units (or postas) along 250 miles of the Napo River and serves 100+ villages and a population of over 20,000. Mission Doctors serving at HSC primarily treat infections, anemia parasites, malaria, malnutrition, and tuberculosis, as well as trauma.

We reached out to the Hospital Administrator, Gabi Filonowicz about Lucy's service "For nearly two years, we have had Dr. Lucy among us who, silently like a little ant, cares for the little ones of the Napo River every day. Jesus has said whoever receives the least of these in my name receives me. So, this is how our Lucy fulfills God's will every day - curing the children who come to the hospital in Santa Clotilde.

What joy must be in the sky of every smile of the healthy child cared for by Dr. Lucy. Thank you for this great service at Santa Clotilde."

Dr. Goh shared that she does not do this work alone "We are very blessed to have our young, dynamic long-term MDA volunteer, Dr. Zach who arrived in February 2023 (btw, he is also an excellent cook and baker), along with several volunteers doctors from Spain and the USA, either volunteering their expertise, or as residents fulfilling their global/rural health rotations. We also had 2 medical students from Rio de Janeiro for a month. Thus, I am continually being kept on my toes with many heads contributing which is way better than only one. Besides sharing their expertise, these visitors or volunteers also bring donations of medicines, medical equipment and supplies."
